January 2017 Council Meeting Highlights

Most of the meeting focused on getting ready for the Annual Congregational Meeting, including finalizing a 2017 budget proposal, but here are some of the other items of interest:

- **1. Thank You Notes** from Council were sent to the videographer from Voices who put together a segment from the Family Fun Fest. (you can see the video on our website.) See Jeanmarie Mullen for more information.
- 2. The Congregation received several **Thank You Notes** for your generosity as follows:
 - from the Spooner House thanking us for our support and wishing us a happy holiday and for gifts of \$200 and \$700.
 - from the Valley Diaper Need Awareness Network, thanking us for our contribution of diapers.
 - from BHCare, for our donation to the Under the Tree Holiday Giving Program.
 - from the NE Synod, World Hunger Team, thanking us for our gift of \$500.

- **3. Job descriptions** for Sexton, Administrator, and Director of Music were approved. See Jeanmarie Mullen for more information.
- **4.** The **125**th **Anniversary Planning Committee** is having regular meetings. Contact Julie Cormack if you are interested in helping out with the planning.
- 5. The Finance Committee is authorized to get a credit card with a limit of \$475 per month for purchasing office supplies and similar items.
- **6.** We reviewed the **Church Storm Cancellation Process**. In the event we need to cancel one or both Services or Sunday School, we will inform the Congregation by email to those that have one, change the phone mail message for people that call the Church phone number, and post with local TV stations. - 7. The **Church Profile** was accepted and will be distributed to the Congregation after the Annual Meeting. Copies are available in the Narthex and by calling the Church office. Members of the MSP Team will be available after both Services on Sunday, **February 5**th to review and discuss the content and receive your feedback on the Profile. Contact the Church Office for a copy and Rick Kaeser for more information.
- **8.** We were invited to **Safe Church Training** at St. James Lutheran Church in Southbury on **February 11**th. There is no cost to us, but St. James would like to know how many of us will be attending. See Rick Kaeser if you are interested in attending.
- **9.** We will be conducting a **Church Census** by sending out a letter for everyone to complete and return as part of an effort to ensure that we have the most accurate information on Church membership as possible. Your cooperation with a prompt reply will be greatly appreciated. Contact Pastor Linda Kraft for more information.
- **10.** A list of 2017 Council Priorities was discussed and agreed to by Council. This will be part of the Annual Report and shared with the Congregation at the Annual Meeting. —See Rick Kaeser for more information.

2017 Annual Congregational Meeting Highlights

- 1. Copies of the Annual Report are still available in the Narthex, or by calling the Church Office.
- 2. New Council members are Katelyn Mullen, Tom Solomon, Vicki Napomiceno and Karin Schidat.
- 3. Call for support:
- Christian Education Ministry needs more help with Sunday School

- Jeanmarie Mullen noted that with all the newly baptized babies and new members with young families, there is a dire need for help with the preschool Sunday School
- M&O is asking people to step up and co-chair events.
- 4. Karin Schidat mentioned that the Prayer Shawl Ministry began in 2005 and that over 400 shawls have been made, to date. Additionally, over 100 Prayer Squares have been made.
- 5. Spooner House is looking for volunteers to make meals for the 4th Thursdays in June and August. See Ellen Fritz to let her know you can help out with one of those dates.
- 6. E-giving has been launched and we now have "*I give electronically*" cards in the pews, which provide worshipers with something to place in the offering plate. These cards have a QR code enabling visitors to make a contribution.
- 7. Council expects to form a Call Committee of six people at the February Council meeting. Four members have volunteered so far. Let Rick Kaeser or one of the Council members know if you are interested.
- 8. Resolutions: all 5 Resolutions proposed in the Annual Report were approved. Refer to the Annual Report for more information.
- 9. **Discussion on amending the Constitution**: Council would like to change the date of the Annual Meeting to the *last Sunday* in January instead of the *4th Sunday* in January. For the years in which there are 5 Sundays in January, like this year, it is very difficult to prepare for the Annual Meeting in the time allotted. There was a brief discussion and those present expressed their agreement. In order to amend the Constitution, the Congregation must vote to approve it at two separate Congregational meetings. This could take 1 to 2 more years to approve.
