Pastor's Corner

Dear Disciples

"Let your light shine before others, so that they may see your good works and give glory to your Father in heaven." -Matthew 5:16

The beautiful thing about light is that it spreads farther than we would expect. The smallest flame can cast a circle of light to see an entire room, a small fire can be seen from miles away in the dark of night. In the same way, we all have light to shine and this during month of stewardship we will be focusing on this theme of "letting our light shine". We will hear reflections from members of the wider community on how our giving at Immanuel spreads God's light and love to countless people in various ways; we will hear stories from members of Immanuel about what it means to them when they share their gifts and light; we will give thanks to God together for all the ways light shines in the darkness.

This is a generous place filled with compassionate servants of God. When people ask about Immanuel, I always tell them how incredibly generous you all are. Here are some examples:

- When children coming in from Puerto Rico needed winter coats, you dug through closets and hit the stores and we collected over 50 coats in less than a week
- When the challenge was set to raise \$300 for ELCA World Hunger and 100 items of food for Spooner House, you met this goal in less than 48 hours and then <u>doubled</u> it in just over a week
- The corner outside my office is filled with food, toys, and blankets for pets in local shelters
- Generous giving has paid towards the furnace fund faster than planned for (and kept us from paying more in interest)
- Children have collected coins and held successful fundraisers to support Julio as a Compassion child in the Sunday School
- Volunteers dedicate incredible amounts of time, ideas, and energy involved in ministry

These are just a few examples, and they have helped us to grow in faith and been part of God's light shining into the world.

So, why give to Immanuel? For each, the reasons will look a little different, but ultimately, we are called to give since God has entrusted us with these blessings and we all seek to make a difference. We can talk about numbers and percentages, we can talk about bottom lines and increases, but at the heart of stewardship is faith. It is faith that God is using us to make a difference in the lives of others. It is faith that we use all the gifts God has put in our care to show God's love for the world. It is faith that the Holy Spirit is doing something amazing at Immanuel and we are called to be a part of it. It is faith that even if we put our last two coins in the offering then God will multiply the impact of our giving. It is faith that we will be wholly transformed by this growing light.

This is a generous community, filled with faithful and compassionate people, and together we can continue to "let our light shine"!
